7. Guided Pathways Project Updates (Workgroups)

- Career and Program Mapping (Pillar 1: Clarifying their Pathway)
 - Recommendation of a Career Exploration Platform
 - · Perkins Grant and CTE Funds
 - Joel Gagnon and Jill Carbone led a great discussion on the two career exploration platforms regarding their recommendation and received lots of feedback from various individuals on the Steering Committee with a goal to officially recommend one in February.
 - A task force will be meeting early in the Spring semester to choose a platform
- Persistence Project (Pillar 3: Staying on their Pathway)
 - Jeff Judd shared that the Persistence Project has 40 faculty members, and everyone is extremely engaged and enthusiastic about the work!
 - Next Steps are to reach out to those faculty members and start implementing the persistence strategies in January at the start of the semester.
- Onboarding/Entering the Pathways (Pillar 2: Entering their Pathway)
 - Angella VenJohn shared that while the Onboarding
 workgroups have not had the opportunity to meet since
 October due to their meetings falling on holidays, the Student
 Experience workgroup has been meeting and they have
 identified 6 types of students for the Step 1 of the Six Steps to
 Success and have updated the applying process accordingly.
 - Next Steps are to incorporate our assessment tool once that gets chosen and integrate program mapper.
- CA Demonstration Project (Pillar 1, 2, 3 & 4)
 - Nan Ho shared that training and attending CA Demonstration Project meetings were unbelievably valuable and beneficial for us in learning how Cohort 1 overcame their barriers.
 - We have our own CA Demonstration Project team here on campus, and our next steps are to build our team.
