5. Accreditation Institutional Self Evaluation Report's Quality Focus Essay

 - Dr. Kristina Whalen explained the QFE is part of our institutional selfevaluation report and it is not used to determine whether or not we meet accreditation but asks us to make bold choices on the road to improvement and to capture those in an essay.
 - Jin Tsubota followed that by sharing that the draft QFE topics include what we are planning to do in the next 5 years and identify the areas we can improve. The areas we have chosen to focus on are Tutoring and Academic Support, Guided Pathways Success Teams, and Equity and Anti-Racism Professional Development.

- Joel Gagnon shared that we now have access to the Program Mapper Authoring tool and are working on creating maps within it and setting up a review process for "approving" them before they are officially published.
