The Guided Pathways project allows us access to other community colleges as well as an abundance of resources and coaches. The Guided Pathways team here at Las Positas will attend 6 institutes over 3 years to learn from other colleges. Our major goals are to support efforts aligned with the pillars, implement those efforts, and create student success teams in 3 years.

Kristine Woods shared Vicki Shipman's Initiative pertaining to Career Technical Education Outreach and Program Mapping. 30 colleges have adopted Program Mapper already, it was mentioned that the use of Program Mapper could be a powerful way to make our program maps student facing, supporting our work in Pillar 1 and 2. Through Strong Work Force funds, Program Mapper has been purchased in order to fulfill the CTE work needed to be completed this year as part of Strong Work Force and our Perkins Grant. Guided Pathways needs to research if this platform would work to make our academic programs student facing and support our desire to link to career and labor markets. Meetings in the next couple of weeks will look at Program Mapper, with Chabot and the District invited to participate in the discussions.

6. Guided Pathways Initiative Updates

- Career and Program Mapping (Pillar 1: Clarifying their Pathway)
- Meetings every 2nd Friday from 1 3pm
- Joel Gagnon & Jill Carbone shared their slide deck pertaining to Early Career Intervention and discussed Career & Program Mapping in relation to their goals. There are 3 main groups of students; undecided, somewhat decided, and fully decided with each of the groups having their own needs and outcomes. The greatest need is in career exploration as 20% of students are undecided. Early career exploration aims to help the undecided students find their purpose and direction and guide them onto their pathway sooner.
- Persistence Project (Pillar 3: Staying on their Pathway)
- Meetings every 2nd Monday from 1 3pm
- Jared Howard shared his slide deck pertaining to the Persistence Project and Connections Workgroup. The three main goals associated with this are to increase student persistence, increase faculty happiness, and inspire all faculty to adopt the project. Discussed engagement protocol which provided ideas and suggestions on how faculty could positively engage with students pre-semester, the first three weeks of class, and how to continue the rest of the semester. The goal was to have 20 faculty members volunteer to be a part of the project, and we were surprised to have 22 current faculty members express and interest in being involved.

Angella VenJohn suggested reaching out to ConnectUp team for resources and support.

- Onboarding/Entering the Pathways (Pillar 2: Entering their Pathway)
- Meetings every 4th Friday from 1 3pm
- Angella VenJohn shared her slide deck for Entering the Path and the Six Steps to Success: Student Engagement Workgroup. Discussed the goals for this year pertaining to the Six Steps to Success with steps 1 (Application), 5 (Student Education Planning), and 4 (Registration) being the main focuses. These goals will include things like revising the application process to reflect different student populations, reviewing and revising the student education planning process so that all students get accurate information and education plan, and incorporating early career assessments for guided self-placement and linking those assessments to programs of study and Las Positas.
