Tommy Orange is an American novelist and writer from Oakland, California. He attended community college and went on to receive his MFA from the Institute of American Indian Art. Orange is a citizen of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes of Oklahoma.

Summary of *There There* from GoodReads:

“Tommy Orange's wondrous and shattering novel follows twelve characters from Native communities: all traveling to the Big Oakland Powwow, all connected to one another in ways they may not yet realize. Among them is Jacquie Red Feather, newly sober and trying to make it back to the family she left behind. Dene Oxendene, pulling his life together after his uncle's death and working at the powwow to honor his memory. Fourteen-year-old Orvil, coming to perform traditional dance for the very first time. Together, this chorus of voices tells of the plight of the urban Native American--grappling with a complex and painful history, with an inheritance of beauty and spirituality, with communion and sacrifice and heroism. Hailed as an instant classic, *There There* is at once poignant and unflinching, utterly contemporary and truly unforgettable.”

MICHELLE ONTIVEROS

Michelle Ontiveros (she/her) is a first-generation college graduate with a bachelor's degree in Biology from UC Riverside and a master's degree from UC Irvine in Ecology & Evolution.

Currently, she is a Director of Quality Assurance & Regulatory Affairs at Charles River Laboratories and leads a team of 12 Quality professionals across four blood donation centers in the US. Throughout her career, she has held laboratory technician, R&D scientist, and various Quality Assurance positions in fields including vaccine clinical research, cosmetics manufacturing, and various pharma disciplines.

In addition, her identity as a proud queer, Mexican-American, cis-woman inspires her advocacy for all minorities and LGBTQIA+ access to STEM resources and information.



JOSE ORTIZ

Jose Ortiz is a doctoral candidate at the City of Hope National Medical Center's Irell & Manella Graduate School of Biological Sciences at the Beckman Research Institute. Jose obtained his B.S. in Molecular, Cell, and Developmental Biology (MCDB) at UCLA. While at UCLA, Jose completed his thesis on latent HIV establishment and virus evolution during acute infection in patients undergoing antiretroviral treatment. He is the winner of a pre-doctoral Ford Fellowship award. He is a DACA recipient and originally from Tijuana.

Jose is motivated to combine art and science to answer important questions about biology and human health. His passion led him to become an expert in immunofluorescence microscopy to visualize tissues at the cellular level using various protein markers. After completing his PhD, Jose plans to pursue post-doctoral training in the field of stem cell biology and regenerative medicine. His goal is to become a professor and mentor diverse students in STEM. Outside the lab, Jose enjoys painting, running, and exploring bars and restaurants with family and friends.

DEBBIE SULCA

Debbie Sulca moved from Los Angeles, CA to Hanover, NH to pursue a master's degree in the Earth Sciences department at Dartmouth College. For her thesis, she is studying mercury (Hg) contamination in a previously contaminated river's floodplain to find if there is a way to predict where Hg contamination will be higher versus lower based on the river's dynamics. Her thesis includes field work, laboratory work, and GIS.

Debbie started her non-traditional route through academia at Santa Monica College where she got her Associate in General Science before transferring to UC Davis. At UC Davis she earned a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Toxicology with an emphasis in Ecotoxicology and Environmental Chemistry and a minor in Latin American and Hemispheric studies. After graduating from UC Davis in the summer of 2020, she applied for graduate school during her gap year.



JESSE TORRES

Born and raised in Los Angeles, I am the son of immigrants and the only one in my family to earn a college degree in STEM. After 10-12 years of slow and steady work and school, I received a Bachelor of Science in Aerospace Engineering from California State Polytechnic University Pomona.

I am a Spacecraft Assembly, Test, and Launch Operations Engineer at Millennium Space Systems where I get to work on Satellites and awesome new technology.

My life goal is to one day have a company where I can provide internship opportunities to students from underrepresented communities so that they too can get the exposure necessary to gain interest in STEM and get the opportunities that many of us wish we had.

When I'm not working on Satellites, I enjoy discovering new music, watching Formula One Racing, rollerblading, playing video games, and spending time with loved ones.

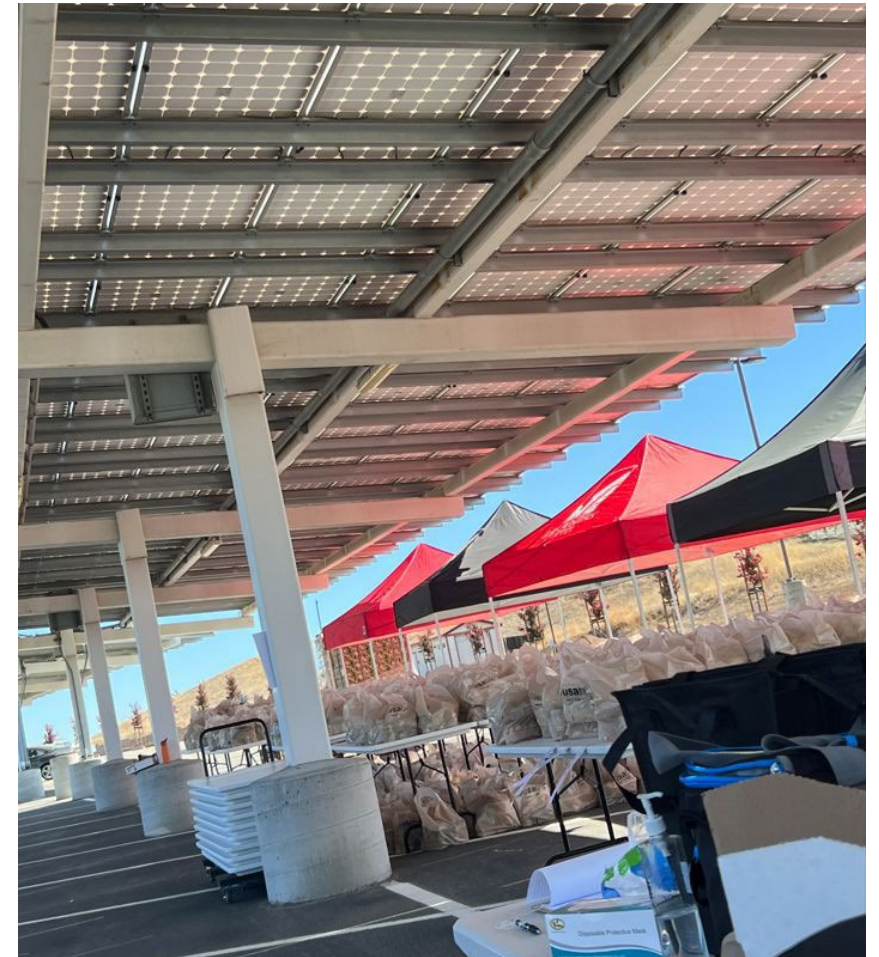

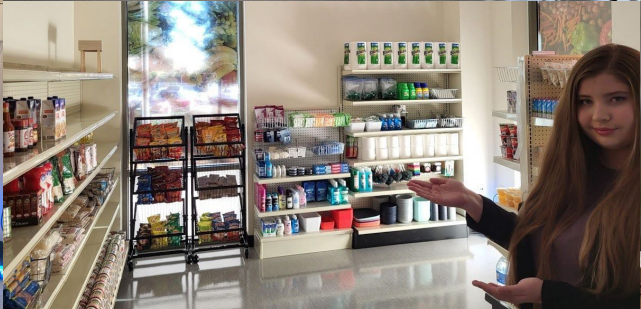

LAS POSITAS COLLEGE COMPLETED PROJECTS

Meditation/ Prayer Room:

Renovation of an unused space within Bldg. 2400 was converted to a meditation/prayer space for students, faculty and staff to use when needed.

Project completion August 2019



Locker Replacement PE Complex:

The existing men's and woman's team room lockers did not support the current requirements for programs utilizing the rooms. This project removed existing lockers and surplus to another facility, removal of the existing curbs for new locker installation.

Project completion September 2019



Tutoring Center Furniture Refresh:

Portions of the existing furniture within the Tutoring Center was replaced with new furniture, while existing furniture was repurposed into other locations within the Tutoring center.

Project completion September 2019



LAS POSITAS COLLEGE COMPLETED PROJECTS

Soccer Field Turf Replacement Project:

The existing synthetic turf soccer field was approximately 11+ years old. The project removed and disposed of the existing synthetic turf. Installed new shock/drain pad, and completed the installation of the new turf product, including NCAA/FIFA lines and markings for soccer, along with College logo. New removable bollards and protective netting installed for safety measures.

Project completion July 2019



B2400 AV Wall Upgrade:

The existing audio-visual system in Room B2420 was comprised of three projectors and a screen along with AV controls at the lectern. The new system is a LED flat panel system, movable lectern, upgraded speakers and cameras.

Project Completion May 2020



District-Wide Exterior Security Lighting:

Installation of additional lighting poles along with the replacement of existing light poles and wall packs with brighter LED fixtures at the exterior of multiple buildings and multiple outside locations at both Chabot and Las Positas College.

Project Completion September 2020



LAS POSITAS COLLEGE COMPLETED PROJECTS

B1690 Academic Services Renovation:

Project enhanced the functionality of the Academic Services Area. Improvements to the VP office, providing a meeting space, three additional offices and smaller storage area, a more inviting reception area.

Project Completion January 2021



District-wide Emergency Call Station Project:

Project comprises of installation and programming of new emergency call stations (ECS) and retrofitting of existing call stations at both the Chabot and Las Positas College Campuses. Installation of a new ECS server at the Las Positas Campus to match the existing Zenitel/STENTOFON ICX- 500 server and software at the Chabot Campus.

Project Completion February 2021



Temporary Faculty Office Complex:

This project provided modular buildings to accommodate ~ 75 faculty offices, conference rooms, support spaces and a modular restroom unit to support the occupants. A raised, covered walkway with ramps providing connect the modular buildings and restroom unit.

Project completion June 2021



LAS POSITAS COLLEGE COMPLETED PROJECTS

Architectural Barriers B1600

Improvements to accessible counters, safety and security of service windows at the Student Services & Administration Building. Service windows include: Information Desk, Student Services Center, Financial Aid and Admission and Records.

Project completion June 2021



Campus Wide Domestic Water Pump:

The project is intended to provide a booster pump system to raise the overall campus domestic water pressure. Pressure reducing valves will be installed at selected buildings to prevent overpressure of the plumbing fixtures.

Project completion September 2021



AG Science: Horticulture Project:

The New Horticulture Facility is located near the Maintenance and Operations facility at the upper NE part of campus. The project includes, a parking lot for faculty and students, classrooms, Labs, offices and resource area, a greenhouse, and shade structures. The outdoor growing areas will have soil bins, equipment storage and an outdoor learning patio.

Project Completion July 2022



LAS POSITAS COLLEGE PROJECTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

B2100 New Academic Support and Office Building:

This Facility includes English Center with classrooms, computer lab, tutoring and study areas. Math Center with classrooms, labs and the Math Emporium program. Computer Studies including computer labs, networking, maker space and open labs with the expansion of library functions including reference desk, study areas, computer lab, expanded staff offices and library operational support spaces. Faculty offices, dean's suite and student gathering and support spaces will also be in the building.

Occupancy: Fall 2023



Public Safety Complex (PSC) and Advanced Manufacturing and Transportation (AMT) Facility:

This Facility will be co-located to allow for shared linkages between the various programs, classrooms and event spaces. The buildings are located at the NE portion of the upper campus. The PSC project consist of EMS Simulation Lab and Situation Rooms, and Fire Training with Class A burn areas. The AMT project includes automotive tech facility, welding lab, and classroom and lab spaces to provide training of advanced manufacturing processes. Faculty Offices, Dean's suite and support spaces will also be included in the project.

Occupancy: Fall 2023



LAS POSITAS COLLEGE PROJECTS APPROACHING

Site Renovation Project

The Site Renovations will enhance the entrance to the college where the B100 Portables once resided. The intent is to provide a landscape that enhances the LPC's park-like and botanical garden theme. The renovation will have shade trees, Ornamental trees, decomposed granite and boulders, a gathering lawn with the potential to have an outdoor classroom near the front entrance to the Multi-Disciplinary building along with other elements. **Completion Summer/Fall 2023**



AG Science: Viticulture Project

The New Viticulture Facility will replace the existing facilities currently located in/outside of Building 800. The Viticulture Facility will be located adjacent to the New Horticulture. The Winemaking Facility includes classroom and Labs, office and resource areas, Crush pad, Equipment storage, cold storage, and an Outdoor Patio, a visitor center with tasting room, with additional parking for faculty and students. **Occupancy: Winter 2023/24**



LAS POSITAS COLLEGE PROJECTS UPCOMING/FUTURE

UPCOMING PROJECTS – Measure A Bond Program

STEAM: ARTS AND SCIENCES:

The project includes two separate major components: STEAM-Arts and STEAM-Sciences. This project could be designed as an integrated building that houses both uses or as two separate buildings (one for each use).

DEMOLISHION OF BUILDINGS 600 & 800:

The removal of these two buildings will need to occur prior to the new STEAM: ARTS AND SCIENCES project to make room for the New Project.

RENOVATE B1800: This building will be a phase 2 project after the STEAM building is in place, this project will reinvision the space to house the Engineering and Physics programs with other spaces being redeveloped or expanded.

ATHLETIC FIELDS:

This project will occur in two phases. First, the existing synthetic turf soccer field adjacent to Building 2500 will be renovated and resurfaced to serve the community in the near term. The second phase will include the creation of two new sport fields and associated buildings in the northeastern portion of the campus.

FUTURE PROJECTS - Unfunded

STUDENT CENTER:

The new Student Center will be built within the campus core and designed to meet student's daily needs and activities. It will be designed to be the students' home-base on campus – a place to connect with friends, pursue extracurricular passions, and be active members of the Las Positas College community.

DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS 400, 500 and Landscape:

Buildings 400 and 500 would be utilized as Swing Space for projects such as the Student Center, programs would move into these buildings while the Student Center is being built, these buildings would be demolished and site renovations would happen.

AUXILIARY GYM:

The new Auxiliary Gym will be built on a portion of the existing turf field in the northern part of the campus (within the Loop Road) after replacement fields are constructed. The new gym will be designed to accommodate a range of athletic and event uses.

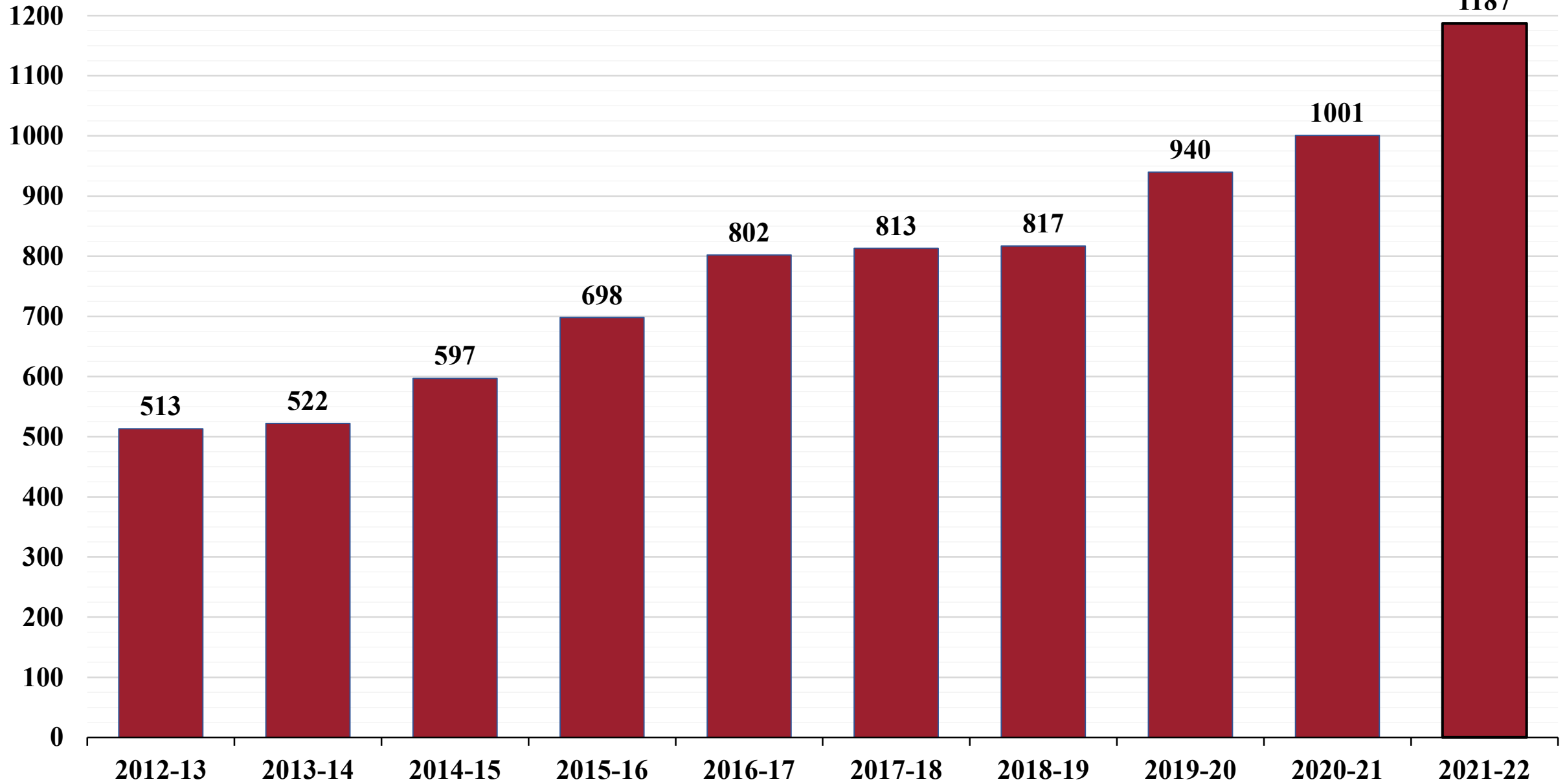

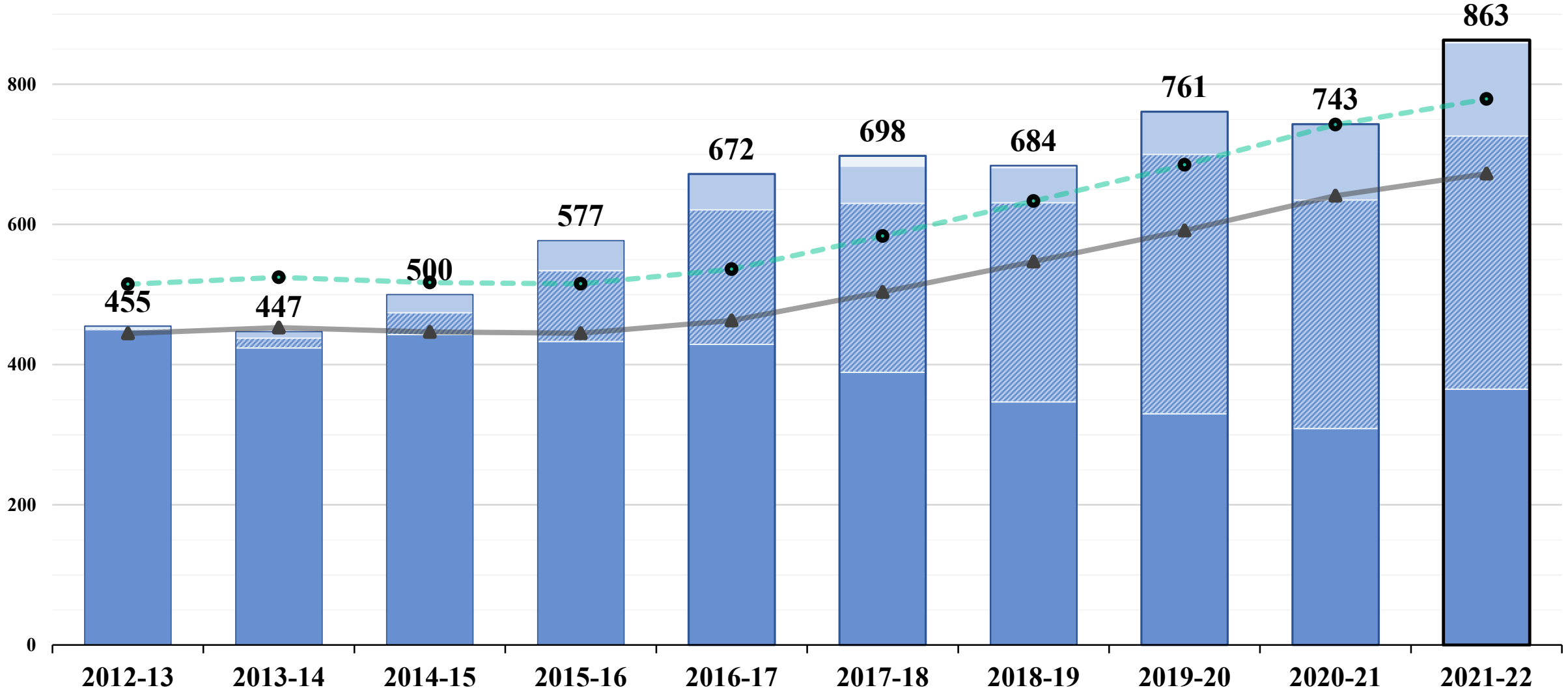

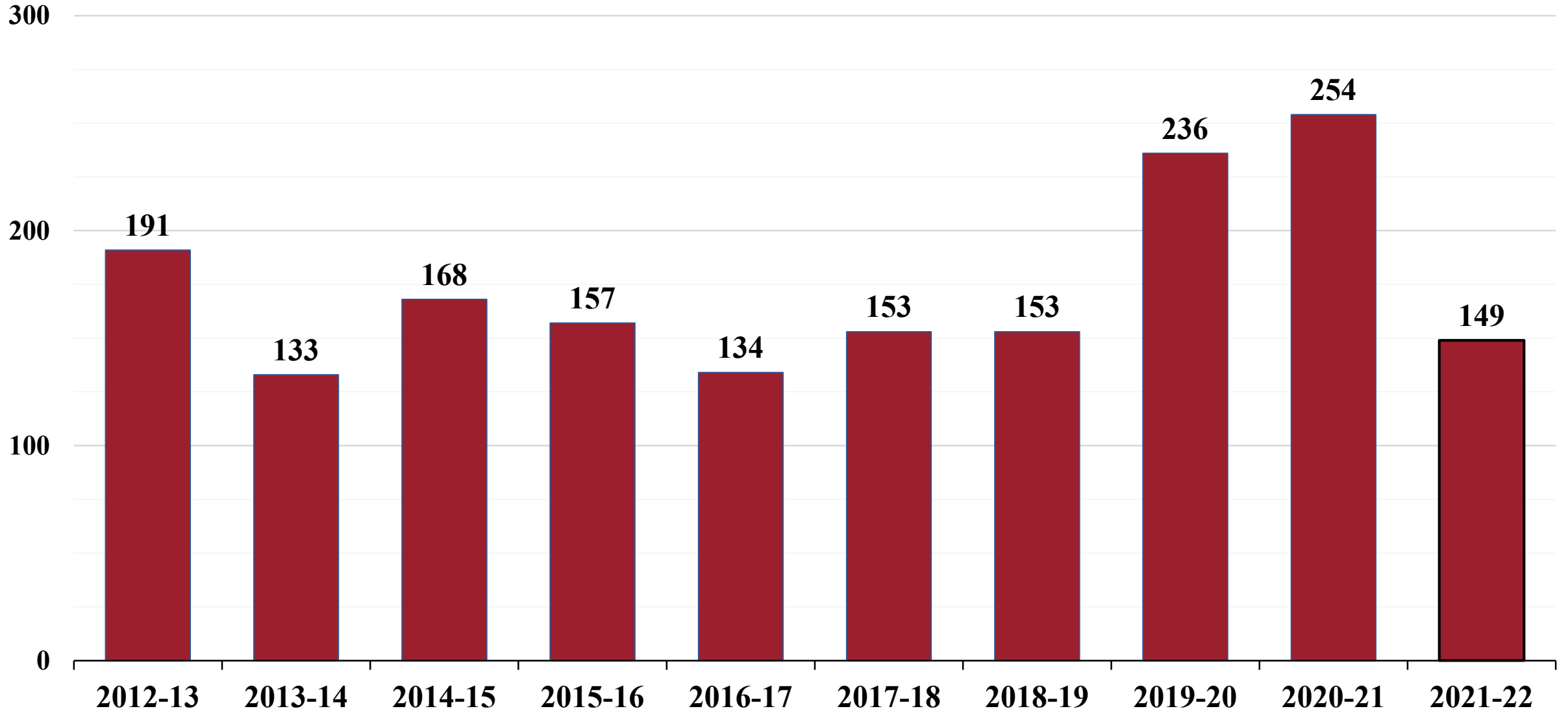


LPC Degree Completions (Headcount)



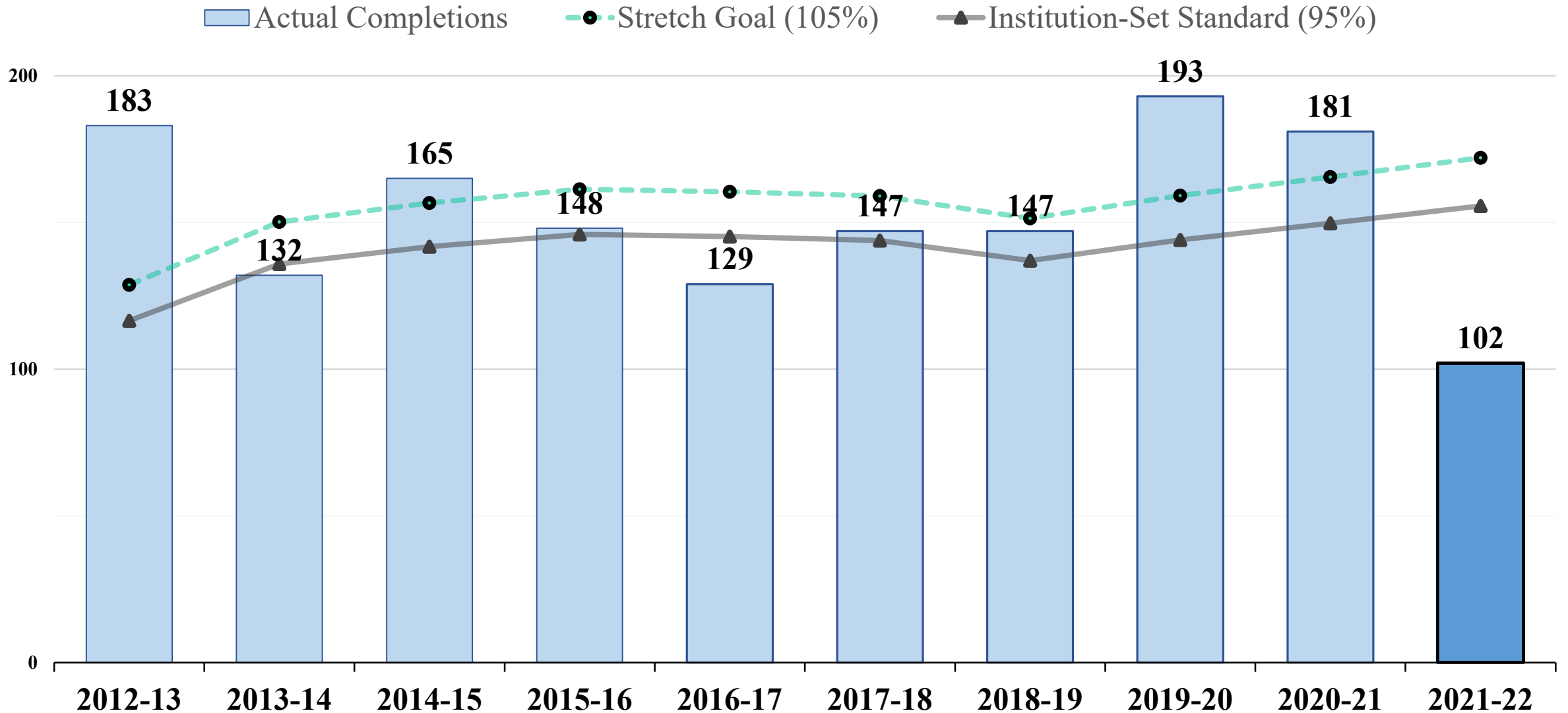

LPC Certificate Completions (unduplicated)



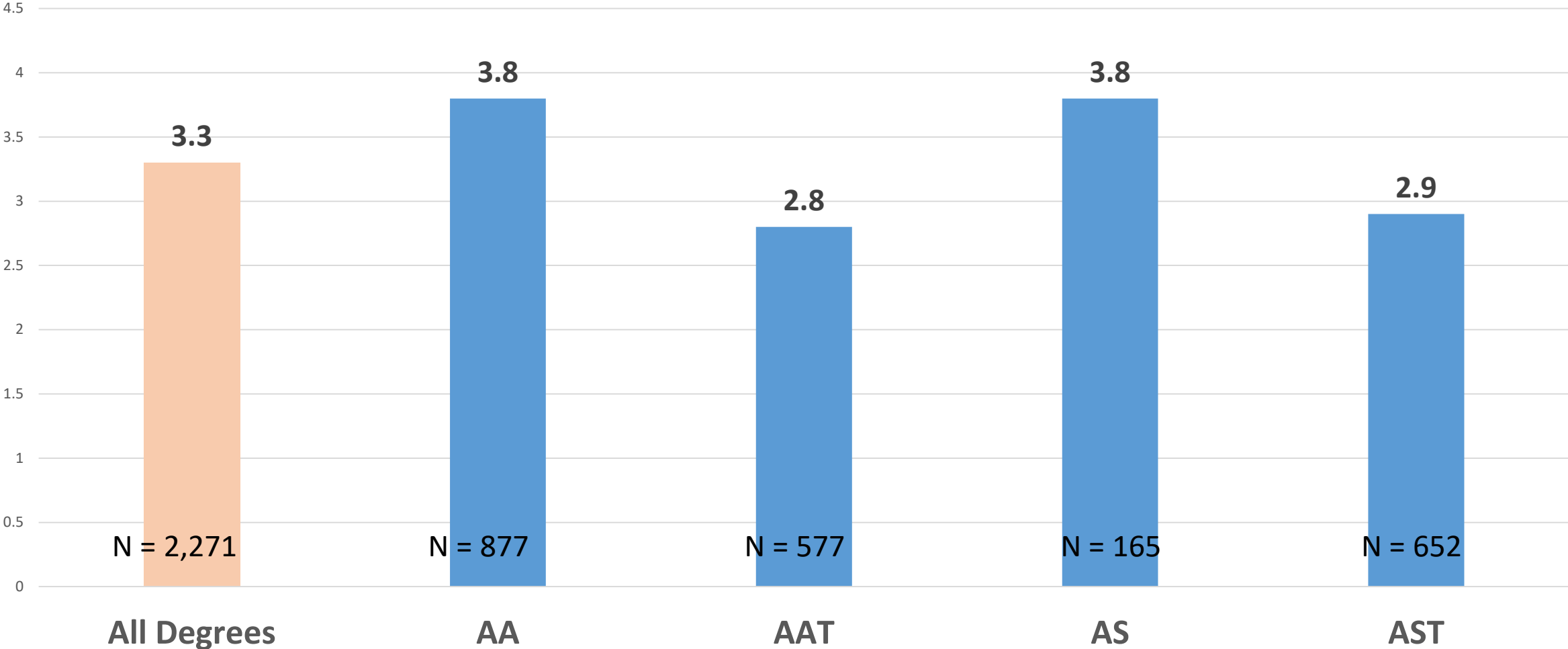
