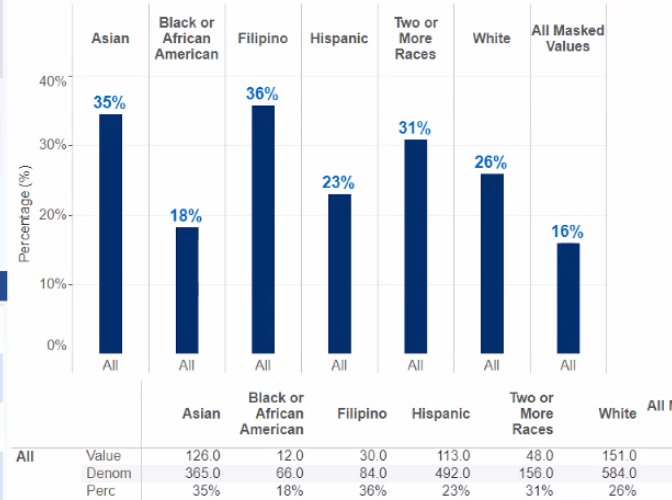

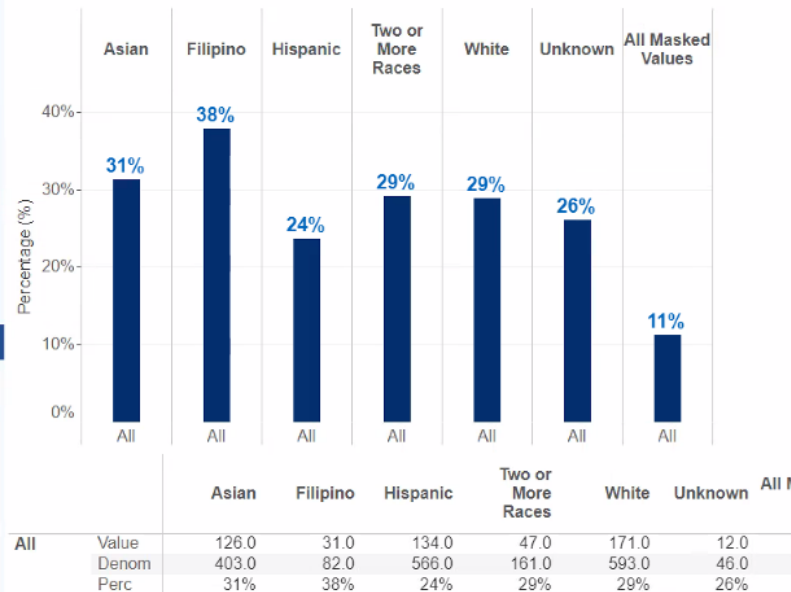
Percentage of students who successfully completed transfer-level math and English courses in the district in selected year

Rajinder pulled data for students who enrolled but did not stay. b. Survey created to determine why they didn't stay and what we could do to support and what supports are available. c. Students have opened the email, but no one has replied to the survey just yet. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. 50% Opened 1st time, 59% opened 2nd time. 0 clicks on the survey. d. Calls will be made on Friday 10/18 to see if students are more responsive. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Will ask questions from the survey to fill some out so there is data. e. The bill will require each campus to (1) implement a policy developed by the respective systemwide chancellor or president for estimating and adjusting cost of attendance information for student parents, as specified, (2) enter student parent data for specified uses into the respective system wide data management information system, as revised to accommodate this data by the systemwide chancellor or president pursuant to the bill, and (3) update its campus net price calculator to include a baseline student parent cost estimate, as specified. c. Jill Oliveira shared that a lot of this will affect the amount of financial aid that can be provided to our students if they are parents. 	
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c) *Institutional Reach & Planning*

a. *Priority Engagement - Elucian*

- i. *Dashboards will allow us to track and know who students are in our Academic and Career pathways*
- ii. *Case Management Tool for Counselors who are now specialists in these pathways.*
 1. *Support based on the number of students in th pathways.*
 2. *Who has completed SEP among other benchmarks.*

b. *IEPI grant - all colleges who are a heads of us recommend a column for students who need to be prioritized for an intentional engagement.*

- i. *Ex: They are on our equity plan*
- ii. *2nd phase of 5 phases, where we get many factors that are being tracked so we have a more sophisticated way to use data smartly to make sure our student success teams are supporting our student.*

c. *Rajinder shared a draft of what this data could look like.*

Potential Priority Engagement Indicators:

- **Include** students who are Veterans, Foster Youth, low Income, first-generation college, or parents
- **Of the above students**, include only students who have an educational goal of transfer (with/without an associate degree), associate degree only, certificate, or are undecided.
- **Exclude** all dual enrolled high school students
- **Exclude** all students who have already earned an associate or bachelor's degree

- i. *Note: First-generation college definitions can change and we will look at several different definitions and the effects that has on the number of students. We use information based on the questions that are asked in CCCApply to determine first-generation status.*

d. *This table has parents with no college experience. This matches the State's definition.*
