Facing off against 26 top schools from around the globe, the Talk Hawks delivered an outstanding performance, earning the 1st Place Two-Year Sweepstakes Award, officially solidifying their status as the top community college speech and debate team in the world! The team also finished 3rd overall in tournament points, ranking just behind Texas Southern and Bradley University, two of the most prestigious four-year programs in the country.
