The ribbon-cutting event, attended by over 120 students, faculty, community members, and local government officials, showcased the state-of-the-art facility equipped with winemaking technology such as a crush pad, stainless steel tanks, bottling line and analysis lab.

LPC's Viticulture and Winery Technology program, located in Livermore Valley Wine Country, offers students hands-on experience in vineyard management, winemaking, and wine hospitality. This new facility enhances the program, providing students with the tools and training to succeed in the wine industry.

The program and ribbon-cutting event received extensive media coverage, including feature articles in the Mercury News, East Bay Times, Livermore Independent, Pleasanton Weekly, and NBC Universal Telemundo.

Balancing the demands of being a full-time student with his role as a caretaker for his grandmother, Raza's journey exemplifies perseverance and innovation.

Raza's honors research, "Bioactive Molecules in Islamically Recommended Foods," merges traditional knowledge with modern neuroscience to explore how social behavior impacts cognitive functions. His work earned him national recognition as one of only two community college students selected to present at the National Research Conference at Penn in October 2024.

Reflecting on his accomplishments, Raza said, "I strive to transform academic inquiry into societal service. Representing Las Positas College on a national stage was an honor, and I'm grateful for the opportunity to share my research and engage with leading scholars."
