## Las Positas College Hosts Global Wine Industry Reception



On June 20, Las Positas College welcomed winemakers and international guests to its new Viticulture and Winery Technology Center for an Industry Networking Social Hour, celebrating the formation of the Global Artisan Vintners Alliance (Global AVA).

The event brought together representatives from nine artisan wine regions across the world—including Portugal, France, Mexico, Argentina, Brazil, Croatia, Hungary, Texas, and California—for an afternoon of conversation, collaboration, and wine tasting. Guests had the opportunity to connect with fellow vintners, tour LPC’s state-of-the-art facility, and learn more about the goals of the alliance.

The Global AVA, led by the Livermore Valley Wine Community and Alameda County Supervisor David Haubert, was formed to promote international cooperation around winemaking, sustainability, student exchanges, and economic development.

Sean Brooks, Vice President of Administrative Services, greeted attendees on behalf of the college, underscoring LPC’s commitment to supporting the local wine industry through education and partnership. The event marked one of the alliance’s first in-person gatherings and reflected Livermore Valley’s growing role on the global wine stage.
