LPC STUDENT NAMED CHIME WORKFORCE SCHOLAR

Yanhong Dong, a student at Las Positas College, has been selected as an inaugural 2025 Chime Workforce Scholar and will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. The Chime Workforce Scholarship recognizes students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership potential, and career readiness while pursuing workforce-focused programs.

The scholarship, provided by the Chime Scholars Foundation, awards \$200,000 in total to 200 community college students enrolled in career and technical programs. Funds may be used to cover educational expenses, including tuition, certification fees, uniforms, and tools needed for workforce entry.

Yanhong Dong is among the first group of students to receive this new scholarship, which supports students working toward certificates or associate degrees in career-oriented fields.

The Chime Scholars Foundation helps students achieve financial progress and build a strong foundation for future careers, while Phi Theta Kappa recognizes academic achievement and leadership at associate degree-granting colleges worldwide.


Introducing The New “Great Wall” of LPC

Las Positas College will host the Alarm Girls+ Fire Camp on September 20-21, 2025, marking the first time this innovative program will be held on the LPC campus.

The First Alarm Girls+ Fire Camp is designed to inspire and prepare young women and nonbinary youth for careers in the fire service, a field where women currently make up just 4.5% of career firefighters nationwide. The camp, staffed entirely by female and nonbinary firefighters, provides participants with hands-on training in firefighting skills, including ladder climbing, hose handling, CPR, and fire safety techniques.

Since its founding in 2018, the camp has been hosted by fire agencies across the Bay Area, including the San Francisco Fire Department, Oakland Fire Department, and Contra Costa County Fire Department

Bringing the camp to LPC highlights the college's ongoing commitment to equity, representation, and workforce diversity. Organized by NorCal Women in the Fire Service in partnership with Las Positas College, the camp not only introduces high school students to firefighting but also creates mentorship opportunities that help build a stronger and more inclusive fire service for the future.



LPC Hawks Coach Named CCCMBCA Northern California Coach of the Year

LPC Men's Basketball is riding high after a historic 2024-25 season, capped off by Head Coach James Giacomazzi being named Northern California Coach of the Year by the California Community College Men's Basketball Association (CCCMBCA). Giacomazzi earned the honor after leading the Hawks to an incredible 28-4 record, their second-ever state championship appearance, and the program's first-ever No. 1 state ranking.

Under Giacomazzi's leadership, the Hawks built a reputation as one of the most competitive teams in California, breaking multiple program records and cementing their place among the state's elite. The recognition reflects not only Giacomazzi's dedication but also the hard work and talent of the entire coaching staff and team.

As the Hawks look ahead to the upcoming season, excitement is already building. With a strong returning core and a program culture rooted in energy, passion, and effort, the team is poised to carry last year's momentum onto the court once again.

The center provides an inclusive space for all students, bringing together programs that reflect the college's commitment to equity and community. Highlights include:

- **Puente Program:** Supports underrepresented students with counseling, academic mentorship, and leadership development to prepare them for transfer to four-year universities.
- **Movement API:** Focuses on Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander students, offering guidance, transfer support, and leadership opportunities.
- **Undocumented Student Support Center:** Offers academic and personal resources for undocumented, AB 540, DACA recipients, and students from mixed-status backgrounds.
- **Pride Center:** Celebrates LGBTQ+ students and fosters a welcoming environment for the college's LGBTQ+ community.
- **Prayer Room:** Provides a peaceful space for reflection, meditation, and prayer for all students, staff, and faculty.

The center also features a large communal area for studying, connecting, and building relationships, reinforcing LPC's dedication to student success and well-being.

Students, faculty, staff, and community members are invited to explore the new space, meet program staff, and join the celebration.
