GEOG 15 Introduction to GIS

- A. Upon completion of Geography 15, students will understand the core functionality of ArcGIS Pro software.
- B. Upon completion of GEOG 15, students will be able to implement basic GIS tasks as spatial analysis, set map projections, find data online, create spatial data, symbolize and label maps, classify data, map layout construction, navigate digital maps.

- JR: The Program Review (PR) Committee wants to keep the PR template concise/brief
- JR: Sections C1/2/3 will probably remain the same
- JR: Note that people will be running their data/reports each year, so we want to keep stuff there.
- JR: He suggests we move the 3-Year Plan deadline note up to the top.
 - All: Agreed.
- Analysis of PSLOs:
 - o JR: We can probably condense questions 3 & 4 /just 1 question about analysis of CSLOs & PSLOs for the AY
 - KS: Disaggregated for accreditation mandate?
 - o KS: Move toward disaggregated data, but we have not received training on it /equity-based data analysis
 - Add "Consider the use of student equity and disaggregated data analysis."
 - SM: Accreditation referencing equitable student outcomes. What kinds of advances will we make? This focuses the effort on equity.
 - o JG/KS: Language adjustment: How about "based on eLumen and/or other data"?
- Challenges:
 - JR: Save that for the end of the 3-year cycle?
 - Based on discussion with others in your program...
 - Remove "disaggregated"
 - \circ address inequities \rightarrow close any equity gaps
 - o explain potential changes *designed to improve*...
- Final question:
 - Liz: Add a comma between "process" and "please"
 - Using CSLO data...
 - Liz: Add comma -- question, please
- CSLOs:
 - o Improve student learning
 - o Based on your analysis
