#### • Enrollments-

Fall 2025 current semester CAP 168 -Enrolled 251 =150% fill rate. These are similar to the high enrollments of 2008.

Spring 2026 enrollment just began 2 weeks ago, and already has 102% fill rate. With a wait list of 24 students

Brian guarantees that students who have completed Intro Class can take any of the advanced classes.

When you see this type of fill rate, it is because you have faculty and instructors that are willing to take more than they're contractually obligated to do. Going above and beyond.

#### • Curriculum Approval – all classes have been updated and approved through the Curriculum Committee. Streamlined the program by removing some classes that were not needed.

#### • ASE Accreditation- had a visit from the ETL. Initial report looks good; some things we need to improve on. But all in all it looks good.

#### • Program Development/Opportunities

Heavy Duty Diesel smog program is running.

Ran a Performance class for the first time last semester it was a lot of fun.

New alignment rack to replace the old one. New Balancer.
