# 2025–2026 Verification Worksheet for CADAA Dependent Student

Your 2025–2026 California Dream Application (CADAA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding State Student Aid, the college needs to confirm certain information that you and your parents reported on your CADAA. To verify that you provided correct information the financial aid office at your school will compare your CADAA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your CADAA information may need to be corrected. You and a parent must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid office at your school. Your school may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact the Financial Aid Office as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

**Important Note:** If the student filed, or will file, an <u>amended</u> 2023 IRS tax return, the student must contact the financial aid administrator before completing this section.

**Instructions**: Complete this section if the student, <u>filed or will file</u> a 2023 income tax return with the IRS. *The best way to* verify income is by using the **IRS Data Retrieval Tool** that is part of FAFSA on the Web. If the student has not already used the tool, go to <u>FAFSA.gov</u>, log in to the student's FAFSA record, select "Make FAFSA Corrections," and navigate to the Financial Information section of the form. From there, follow the instructions to determine if the student is eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2023 IRS income tax information into the student's FAFSA. If you need more information about when, or how to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool see your financial aid administrator. If you do not use or are not able to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, you must request an IRS Tax Return Transcript directly from the IRS to verify your 2023 income.

You will need your Social Security Number, date of birth, and the address on file with the IRS (normally this will be the address used when the 2023 IRS tax return was filed).

If you already have an account, enter your user ID under "Returning Users" section 5. If you are unable to register or you prefer not to use the "Get Transcript Online" option, you must complete the 4506-T Form.**
