



M&O District Vehicle Reservations

Currently at LPC we have 2 - 15 passenger Ford vans for transporting students for approved field trips, A-53 and A-54, to reserve one of these student transport vehicles, user must fill out the attached Vehicle Request Form and submit it to Rita Carson in M&O for processing. For other types of vehicles submit the Vehicle Request form or contact Rita Carson with M&O to discuss specific need and availability of vehicle(s) requested.

Driver's License requirements for vehicle reservations and use:

- To drive a District Vehicle to transport students or passengers you must be an approved driver with a commercial class A or B driver's license with the correct passenger endorsement and DMV Medical Examiner's Report on file with the District M&O Office, demonstrate that you can operate the type of vehicle you are approved to drive and have the Driver Proficiency and Authorized Vehicles sheet signed by the M&O Director on file with M&O with your license and medical examiner's certificate copies attached to this form.
- You will be added to the Employer Pull Notice Program with DMV to receive your driving records to verify that your license is still in active once per year and/or when there is activity on your driving record (i.e.: an accident or ticket).
- To drive a District Vehicle without passengers or students you must have a copy of your driver's license on file with the District M&O Office. The vehicle requested must be available for other's to use and not currently in use for an M&O project. A driver with a standard class C license may drive a District Vehicles (i.e. cargo van(s), pick up truck(s), or box van) as long as you provide a copy of your driver's license on file with the District M&O Office and show proficiency to drive the vehicle requested.
- To use a fork lift the driver must have a valid fork lift operator certificate and provide a copy to M&O Office and the fork lift must be available for use and not currently in use for an M&O project.
- To use a utility/golf cart you must go through the CLPCCD District Golf Cart/Utility Vehicle Operation Program training, available through District Emergency Preparedness and Workplace Safety Office. The request to use a golf cart/utility vehicle by a dept that does not have their own may be requested through Rita Carson with M&O and the cart must be available for use and not currently in use for an M&O project.





Reservations for M&O Conference Room

Conference Room 3123 is available for meeting use for the campus in Bldg 3100 M&O Building, this room can be set up with chairs and/or tables, however the user need it configured and will hold approximately 40 people with rows of chairs only and probably 15-20 with tables - this is my best estimate. The reservations are scheduled through contacting Rita Carson to be added to the room reservation calendar. The room set up and tear down/clean up is the responsibility of the user.
