- Postsecondary education should be a path to a well-paying career aligned with workforce needs.

Office for Civil Rights: FAQs

■ Title VI prohibits recipients of federal funding from discriminating on the basis of race, color, or national origin. All educational institutions, including pre-K, elementary, and secondary public schools and school districts, and public and private colleges, universities, and other postsecondary institutions that receive federal financial assistance, are required to comply with Title VI.





U.S. Department of Education (3/3/25)

Office for Civil Rights: FAQs

A school cannot engage in any programming, graduation ceremonies, housing, or any other aspect of school life that allows one race but not another or otherwise separates students, faculty, or staff based on race. Therefore, school-sponsored or school-endorsed racially segregated aspects of student, academic, and campus life, such as programming, graduation ceremonies, and housing, are legally indefensible under the same "separate but equal" rationale that the Court rejected in Brown.

In other words, these segregationist activities violate Title VI.




Mission Statement/Call to Action






