PBC Tri-Chair Update

- There is no Special PBC meeting in February due to the holiday
- The committee reviews discussion items from the previous week's subcommittee meeting
- Tasks removed from the PBC meeting and assigned to the PBC subcommittee is what is in 3A, setting reserves, allocating funds from the State, and penalties
- The larger group continues to work through how to base the budget allocation model (BAM) and whether to use SCFF or Hold Harmless
- For the fiscal year 2022-23, the BAM will remain the same, which relates to the FTES split
- Due to the change created by the Sheriff's Academy, LPC's percentage may change to 40/60
- The rollback money saved for the SCFF transition requires consideration in terms of how to split the funds
- A point of care when running funds through the model is to remember the amount is split three ways
- Other meeting topics included how to add a line item into 3A and setting aside reserves to cover technology currently under the bond
- The hope is to create a documented process on what categories fall under 3A
- Advocacy at the State level included changes to the base allocation threshold with an FTE recalculation from 15 to 9, adding a cost of living metric to the supplemental, and removing the success metric
- A recalculation of FTE resolves the threshold issue, and an ask for 3 FTE with an acknowledgment for the base allocation to reconceptualize
- It provides an opportunity to create new levels which would stabilize districts statewide
