A sign up request was emailed out. We need representation on all committees so classified professional voices are heard and so we can get updates about what is happening around campus.
6. **Updates**
 - 8.1 Committee Reports – All
Guided Pathways (Kristi Vanderhoof): Guided Pathways launched a student-parent webpage. Direct student-parents to this site for resources, including how to get diapers from Basic Needs, Title IX protections, lactation room locations, and more. Has there been development in providing refrigerators in lactation rooms? This has not been recently discussed. Discussion regarding safety concerns with regular mini fridges since anyone can access them. The Career and Transfer Center will be remodeled and have a pathways support center incorporated. The Career and Transfer Center will temporarily relocate to room 1642 during the remodel.

DEMC (David Rodriguez): There have been discussions regarding allocation of growth funding now that we are off Hold Harmless. Growth needs to be carefully managed since the state doesn't necessarily fund the growth. An estimate of approximately \$1.2 million dollars needs to be allocated; 50% of this amount will be allocated through the standard 60% - Chabot/40% - LPC model but remaining funds are still being considered and may be split

depending on each colleges' productivity numbers (e.g., section fill rates, persistence rates). This conversation is ongoing. David asked the committee if there were thoughts about bringing the discussion of budget/ allocation to the shared governance level and the response was that this will be considered after discussion with the FA.

RAC (David Rodriguez): The committee will review updated practices for instructional equipment requests and classified/administrative position requests. Question if the committee has thoughts regarding Dr. Foster's response to the CAP results (no positions will move forward this year)? The committee has not met since the response; RAC is an open meeting so anyone may join to listen in on upcoming discussions. The positive thing is that the current process evidences needs.

Professional Development (Aubrie Ross): The tri-chairs discussed the future of flex days in a compressed calendar. Convocation will run as normal. College day will have department/division meetings and, per the new FA contract, four hours of DEIAB training for faculty, which will likely take place on this day. Student Services offices may close at lunch to attend a keynote speaker or facilitated sessions. Flex day will run similarly to college day, though Student Services offices will likely be expected to maintain open hours. Dr. Foster may allow up to three days of office closures per year for these offices but specifics have not yet been discussed.
