Curriculum Report for CTE Committee Meeting on September 23, 2025

The Curriculum Committee has met twice this academic year, on August 18 and September 15, 2025.

- Student Learning Outcomes have now been included in the course outlines with CurriQunet META. Faculty can enter them with new or updated curriculum. They will be a part of the Course Outline of Record and approved through Curriculum Committee.
- The Curriculum Committee also discussed:
 - Incorporating equity considerations into writing curriculum based on Inclusion,
 Diversity, Equity, Anti-Racism, and Accessibility (IDEAA).
 - Phases II and III of Common Course Numbering. Phase IIA will be effective Fall
 2026; Phases IIB and III will be effective Fall 2027.
- A new program, a noncredit Tutoring program, is on the agenda for approval at the next meeting.

CTE Committee Apprenticeship Report September 23, 2025

Drone Technology: The "sponsor" really isn't a sponsor, it is a non-profit organization that will be recruiting employers to place students. The lead NPO, Good Tech Life, is also trying to obtain a grant. This is a stretch with this organization. Given Dan Cearley's instructor load and bandwidth plus the opportunity as presented, we most likely will not be moving forward. Without larger employers like CalTrans, PG&E and CalFire, it is doubtful.

Early Care and Education: Faculty from ECE are exploring an apprenticeship opportunity for students. Challenges include no single "sponsor" or employer. Similar to the Drone Technology opportunity. Chabot has engaged with a quasi sponsor "Launch" to support their ECE apprenticeship program however has been met with challenges. ECE faculty planning to confer with Chabot ECE faculty.

Marine Technology: Total of 4 sections Fall 2025
