- Fire program wants this up and running ASAP to meet industry partners' needs
- Understanding that SLOs must be approved too; + Board approval, Catalog, etc.
- They are seeking a faster route to getting these courses approved.
 - > Can we find any more efficiencies?
- On 3/8, FST is meeting to propose some model ISA policy language.

Committee Comments:

- EB: Can we simplify the title /remove "Chief Officer"? And it's not on 171 [Liz: Add]. > Mike: Jeff needs it there.
- EB: What is AHJ? > Mike: AHJ = Agencies Having Jurisdiction. (All: Let's use the acronym and spell it out.)
- EB: What's next VP approval, Board, Catalog > Can Academic Services fast-track it to be effective in Fall 24?
- AM: We're in schedule production for Fall 2024 now done at the end of March. Registration begins in April.
 - > CK: He doesn't know that we need to have it before registration. It needs to be published in something before it's advertised. Maybe we could have a "This section will be updated with new standalone courses..." / feasible given that it's a virtual Catalog...
 - > EB: Could it be added <u>later</u> to the Schedule? \rightarrow AM: Yes, as long as it's advertised 30 days before class start
 - > NH: This would be a major change to a process that could affect our colleagues and the work they have to do. We haven't really talked through this process with VP's office, CC Chair, etc. Also: This has been discussed with Community Ed, just in case this doesn't make Catalog & Schedule in time.
 - > MN: Audience They're waiting in the wings and already being pointed to this class by their supervisor?
 - > CK: They're teaching them there / we don't have to schedule & teach these classes on our campus?
 - \rightarrow Mike believes so that they're waiting in the wings and these courses would be taught off-site.
 - MN: Is there a shortage of people in these positions (in the near future or down the line)?
 - → Mike: He knows there's an urgent need to get this done, but not sure RE: shortage.
 - ➤ NH: Where are these professionals getting their training now?
 - o Mike: At least one private company does it. They're seeking an in-house option for their employees.
 - CK: He suggested that we look at campus policy (vs. Board) we don't want Board usurping power from LPC Academic Senate.
 - o Mike: That's in line with what they're thinking he's hoping these will be the exception.
 - o EB: Maybe it is approved for Fall 2024 but it doesn't get *scheduled* until later...
 - SM: It's a question of whether there's bandwidth to do this work, but it's *getting beyond our purview*. He's in favor of supporting this; it's setting a precedent. Context: They're revenue-producing classes.
 - o EB: It is and it isn't. Sidebar: We don't want to place undue burden on VP Academic Services.
 - > CK: He's not in favor of creating curriculum for money in this Committee. We should still have a robust review of curriculum here.
 - o This is really for the students to get continuing education and get promoted.
 - o For things like this, we could limit it by "This is when it's okay..."
 - AM: She is fine with the exception of this effective date. But when it's outside of our normal process, VP Academic Services office needs to be notified ASAP and then VPAS works with the Dept. on this.
 - > CK: We just need to make sure we have it in something public first /before it's scheduled.
 - Mike: We had the industry partner organizations come to our new Fire Tech coordinator; and because of his background, it's driving this.
 - NH: It's a great opportunity, and we want to be responsive to our industry partners.
 - O Just recognize your own capacity as a committee, and when exceptions can be made. Where does this committee want to be in terms of other kinds of exceptions? Let's reexamine our processes.
 - > CK: Why don't we have a policy come to the Committee for review and have it ready for future reference.
 - EB: I see the Committee's okay with approving it for FA 24. But yes, we need to develop a policy.
 - We wouldn't have a policy for a while though...
 - Per NH/Liz: It would be for April or May Board.
 - NH: Food for thought Many programs have piloted through Community Ed. There's no program coming through at this time /these courses don't add to a certificate. <u>Could Community Ed be an alternate option?</u> This would still be in an ISA (instructional service agreement).
 - o CK: What's the benefit of getting college credit for this?
 - *Mike: He's not certain, as Jeff is the author and knows the specifics.*
 - EB: His question to the Committee do we bring this back for voting with a Fall 2024 effective date? *Yes.*
