1.	Call to Order  Ms. Gecox called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m.	
2.	Review & Approval of Agenda Agenda approved by the committee	Approved Ho/Bodnar
3.	Review & Approval of Minutes – April 12, 2024  Minutes were approved by the committee, with one abstention.	Approved Bodnar/Kutil
4.	Enrollment Updates  Ms. Gecox reporting: New Hawk Day was an absolute success. More people showed up than were registered. Students made it to a workshop and then were enrolled in classes. These numbers reflect that.  Dean Gagnon added: The total amount of students there was 480. We'll do SEPs over the summer. At last year's event we had under 300 students. There were about 800 people total in attendance.  Director Samra shared some interesting data concerning primary sections, fill rates, and enrollments. Committee members discussed findings and concerns.  • Potential adds for Summer and Fall  VP Ho: The deans are reviewing their enrollments and are starting to respond very quickly to looking at high enrollments in summer and fall. We've been in registration a very short time and already have high demand.  The committee reviewed and discussed information from the Ad Astra monitor tool. Seeing tremendous enrollment already for summer and fall, it's extremely important for students to know how to use the waitlist. The committee had questions related to data in the tool, and discussed issues related to waitlisting.

5.	DEMC Updates  Ms. Gecox and VP Ho reporting: The subcommittee for the allocation sheet has been meeting. There's some good discussion going on. We are tending towards the direction of FTES/FTEF. There's also a shift in how we think about the colleges; right now there is a 60/40 split, but we're in discussion to look more at the colleges' need and allocating based on that; what metric to use if that is the chosen direction.		
6.	Continued Discussion of Student Services Dashboard (time allowing)  Ms. Gecox: We met a few weeks ago and will continue to do work on the dashboard. There will be a conversation at the next DEMC. It's still in the early stages.		
7.	Good of the Order Director Samra shared he quickly ran some data called Distribution of Credit FTES by Campus and Year. It shows a trend that LPC's FTES has been going up. The data is weighted. It's not just averaging the percentages.
