6.	DEMC Updates VP Ho and Prof. Powers: A draft memo from the chancellor for discussion was sent out to members of this committee for review. DEMC is looking at changing how to allocate district funding for both colleges. This would possibly start 2027-28. This is FTEF newly funded by growth. DEMC is looking for feedback by way of questions, concerns, suggestions. Some comments made: • Can we manipulate productivity? (This is a productivity model. We can make decisions that meet productivity). • Why not just base on FTES? • Will this be an ask to take in students above cap size? Colleagues won't be happy with that. • The intent is good and supported; but there seems to be a misalignment/imbalance for my division. Seems to penalize labs and skill-based instructions. Be care when conducting a district-wide policy and see how it affects certain division. (It will fall on this committee to provide the slice of pie). • As the model goes into effect, how does it change this committee's decision making? • Does codifying the 60/40 put LPC at a risk? • It's an excellent model as it is.
