We currently have three full time faculty. We need a minimum of one additional full time position, and that would bring our total to four full time positions. We have less full time faculty than several disciplines smaller than History Department. The History Program will continue to offer the same number of sections--staffed instead with part-time faculty. There may be a difference in the quality of instruction and a potential lack of availability of faculty to meet regularly with students - especially given the recent departures of some of our most seasoned adjuncts. It is increasingly difficult for the History Program to expand course offerings to meet demand and to develop desperately needed World History courses. The three full time historians all have a strong background in US History. A full time faculty member is needed who can teach and revise the Western Civilization courses. We also are in need of more full time faculty who can teach distance education courses. It is difficult to cover staffing during sabbatical and workload banking leaves. Most importantly, more full time faculty are needed to complete the heavy and increasing administrative workload demanded of all college programs including SLOs, yearly Program Review updates, scheduling, peer evaluations, and new adjunct hiring. In Fall 2017 we were asked to add two sections (late start). We had difficulty finding an adjunct qualified to teach the added DE sections since there were no available rooms on campus. One one full-time historian teaches DE sections, and those are the sections we have been adding due to lack of space on campus. It is crucial our next hire also be able to teach DE.

Ideally another full-time faculty member would be able to teach US History and Western Civilization as well as our specialty courses and distance education. We are especially in need of a full-time instructor with a strong background in World and non-Western historical fields. Las Positas is one of the only community colleges in the state that does not offer courses in World history, and adding a faculty member with expertise in that area would be vital to our success in fulfilling that need. Moreover, an additional full-time faculty member would make it possible to expand/develop our curriculum in other areas as well. The range of courses that we are able to offer is slimmer than that of most of our northern California counterparts. We also have the Puente Program and the Umoja cohort on campus. Reviving the African-American History and Mexican-American History courses would enhance the students' educational experience. It is difficult to consider and to plan expanding our curriculum in our current state, in which we often struggle to staff our existing course offerings. Ultimately, our department would like to be able to expand and update our curriculum to best serve our growing and increasingly diverse student body.
