

Creating New Quizzes


CLPCCD Timeline

1. Spring 2024: Collect training resources, and input them into a Canvas course that can serve both colleges.
2. Summer 2024: Begin the transition to New Quizzes (NQ) by offering training and resources.
3. **Fall 2024: Ramp up training of all faculty in NQ.**
4. Spring 2025: (Optional) Faculty begin migrating to NQ in their classes.
5. Fall 2025: Turn off Classic Quizzes (CQ).

Canvas has not announced a sunset date for Classic Quizzes nor an enforcement date for NQ.

Getting Started

- NQ was enabled beginning Summer 2024.
- Use it only in your SANDBOX until at least Spring 2025.

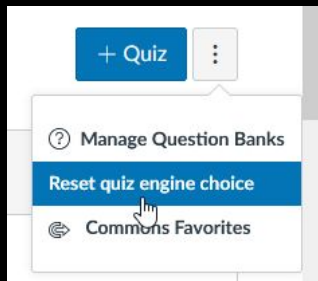

Faculty Benefits

- New question types: Stimulus, Categorization, Ordering, Hot Spot
- Features:
 - Duplicate quizzes
 - Submit for students
 - Waiting period between attempts
 - Build on last attempt
 - Shuffle questions and shuffle answers
 - Reopen
 - Print with or without answers
 - Do not count towards final grade
 - Complete/Incomplete

Surveys (well, sort of)

- No survey tool...but:
 - Zero point quizzes that do not display in the Gradebook
 - Anonymous Grading (course Feature Option)
 - Do not count towards final grade
 - Complete/Incomplete

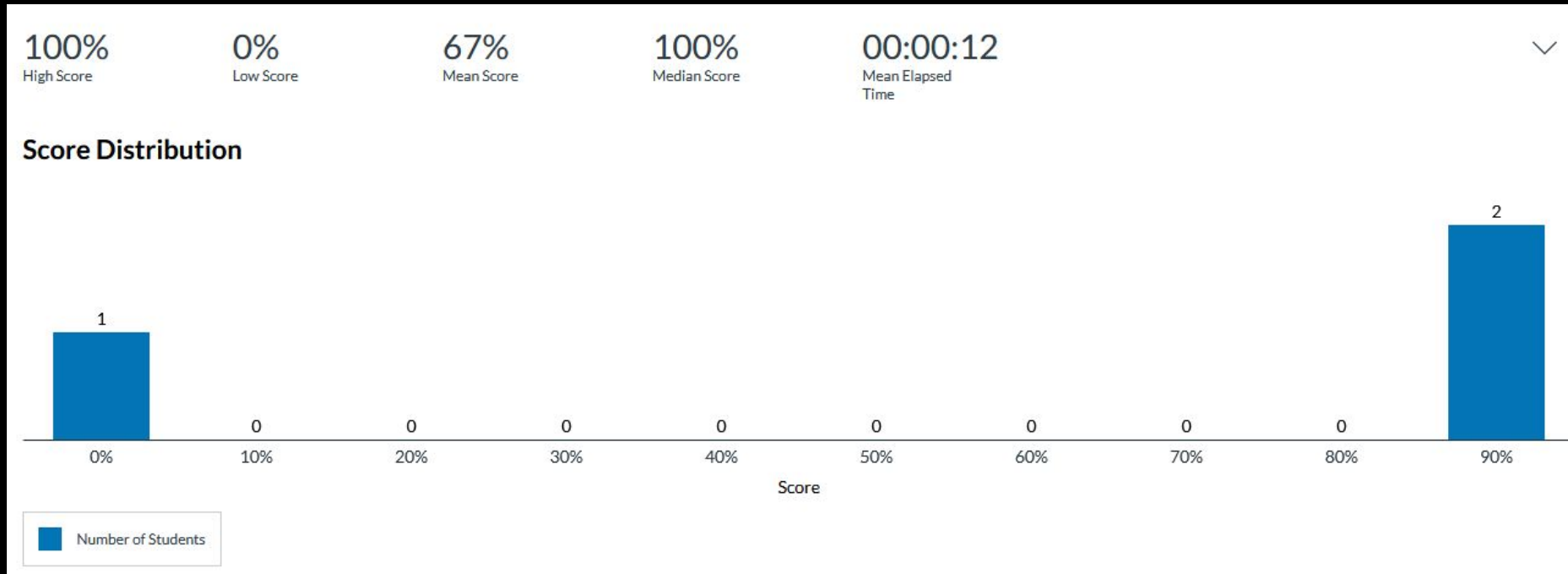
