SECTION 2: DESCRIPTION

Describe the specific equipment or materials requested and a brief explanation of how it will be used. (Please do not include cost data here.)

The theater program is seeking funding to purchase weatherproof, outdoor, general lighting equipment for the amphitheater. This includes lights, lamps, cables, and light trees (hereafter all lumped together under the terms lights or lighting). Though the theater program is initiating the request, and taking on the responsibility of the maintenance of the lights, the equipment will serve the entire campus, making the amphitheater a usable, rentable, and remarkable space. This lighting will make the amphitheater usable for performances, presentations, and general college functions.

How does the equipment replace, upgrade or provide new technology to the college? What do you currently have in place?

There are currently no outdoor lighting fixtures in place for the amphitheater, making it virtually useless as a performance space. Lights were originally slated to be purchased under the bond Measure B, but were cut due to a shortage of funds. Funding the lights would resort the initial concept of the amphitheater to the entire college.

SECTION 3: EDUCATIONAL ITEMS

Which educational programs or institutional purposes does this equipment support?

This equipment would support the theater, music, and dance programs, to start with; however, the potential for space use by many programs is limitless - the amphitheater could be used for orientation days, rental, creating revenue for the college, speeches, general assemblies, etc.

One of the main reasons for including an amphitheater in the design of the new campus facilities was the anticipation of the ability to produce summer outdoor productions. However, without the proper equipment, such productions are impossible and the construction of the amphitheater as it currently stands is unusable and a waste of resource spending.

Currently, the program is in need of outdoor scaffolding, weather resistant walls and flats, and most importantly, outdoor weather resistant stage lighting equipment (lights, trees, etc.) and sound equipment. Much of this was in the initial bond Measure B under FFE, but was pulled due to shortage of funds. These items must be funded in order to make the amphitheater a useable space, not just for the theater program, but for the school as a whole.

SECTION 4: TEACHING AND LEARNING

Describe in detail the impact this equipment or materials will have on teaching and learning.

Creating additional performances spaces for the college continue to reinforce the philosophy f of students first. Currently, students have the opportunity to perform in a black box and proscenium theater space. But, many performances (particularly for music) occur outdoors (concerts, for example). Giving the amphitheater the lighting it needs would allow student to experience the rich tradition of performing outside, to be sure, but it would also allow them to learn and understand how their performance style and technique might need to adjust for such a challenging venue. The amphitheater would create a truly unique learning and performing environment for students and audiences.

Number of classes or sections (per academic year) that will be impacted: 10, on average

Will the Tri-Valley benefit from the equipment, and if so how?

Most definitely – our amphitheater is the only small scale and usable rental amphitheater in the Livermore area. Visitors would be able to experience performances by the college in a unique and beautiful setting, but additionally the space could be rented out to various performance or speaking groups, enriching the arts tradition of the Tri-Valley in a way no other campus can offer.

What is the potential life span of the requested equipment?: 10-15 years

How does this equipment meet or exceed basic sustainability efforts and/or provide renewable resources to the college? Please explain

With the proper maintenance of the equipment, these lights present a limited draw of resources from the college as a whole. By only being used in the summer, or for minor events in the spring and fall, the lights should have the ability to last great length, with minimal energy inefficiency. Additionally, they would only need to be used in the evenings, so again, use by the college's energy would be limited.

What will be required to maintain the equipment, such as regular servicing or upkeep? Who will perform the maintenance and are the costs included in the Finance Section?

Regular maintenance of the equipment will be maintained by Mike Rinaldi, classified employee in the theater department, though lamps (light bulbs) should be purchased through Maintenance and Operations.

Where will the equipment be used or housed? If new storage is needed, describe the storage, location and costs to provide for it. Are these costs included in the financial section?

Lighting equipment, when not in use, will be stored in the theater building. A storage container has been requested by the theater program, in order to facilitate additional space in the scene shop and backstage area for lighting equipment and other theater supplies.

Many of the student learning outcomes, in the theater program specifically, speak to the idea of students being able to participate creatively in productions. Adding the use of the s amphitheater as a performances space will help fine tune their existing performance skills, while at the same time allowing them to create new skills, related to the outdoor performance space. If not funded, the experience of the students continues to be limited by traditional (though beautiful) performing spaces that we have.
