- 3. Proper sitting, can contribute enormously to avoiding Repetitive Strain Injuries in the Back, Neck, Shoulder and Legs
- 4. The back of your chair should not only support your back but help maintain the natural hollow in your lower back.
- 5. Promotes good posture and body alignment: Posture is the position in which you hold your body upright against gravity while standing, sitting or lying down. Good posture involves training your body to stand, walk, sit and lie in positions where the least strain is placed on supporting muscles and ligaments during movement or weight-bearing activities.

Proper posture:

Keeps bones and joints in the correct alignment so that muscles are being used properly.

Helps decrease the abnormal wearing of joint surfaces that could result in arthritis.

Decreases the stress on the ligaments holding the joints of the spine together.

Prevents the spine from becoming fixed in abnormal positions.

Prevents fatigue because muscles are being used more efficiently, allowing the body to use less energy.

Prevents strain or overuse problems.

Prevents backache and muscular pain.

Contributes to a good appearance.

es. Benches are a standard item on most fields and is a program enhancer that most people probably would ot think of until they were not there. The image of the college will be enhanced by a completion of the total roduct along with all the little details.

Benches should last for many years. Access (Total = 1 point) Provide evidence that the requested equipment is consistent with universal design* and will ensure access above and beyond standard capability. The modern athletic bench has a universal style and comfort level. The style that we are considering meets all the basic and necessary needs and universal design for sitting. *Universal design is an approach that addresses and redresses the primary barrier to making expert learners of all students. Some examples include: light switches with large flat panels rather than small toggle switches; buttons and other controls that can be distinguished by touch; bright and appropriate lighting, particularly task lighting; auditory output redundant with information on visual displays; visual output redundant with information in auditory output; contrast controls on visual output; use of meaningful icons with text labels; clear lines of sight to reduce dependence on sound; volume controls on auditory output; speed controls on auditory output; choice of language on speech output. Items incorporating the principles of universal design feature: equitable use; flexibility in use; simple and intuitive; perceptible information; tolerance for error; low physical effort; and size and space for approach and use. Known as "Proposition 65", California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, requires that warnings be provided if a product exposes California consumers to listed chemicals.
