Ordering twenty four basketballs will allow each basketball course the ability to supply a quality basketball to each student during the instruction time. This allows students optimal time on task not to mention a more student centered learning approach. Instructors will be able to diversify learning opportunities by giving each student a basketball. Most importantly, students will have access to a size basketball that meets their learning needs. This helps students meet learning outcomes and provides universal access to all learning objectives regardless of a students ability level.

These basketballs are made with reusable material. By purchasing these basketballs we are able to reuse these basketballs for over seven years. Other ball material such as rubber would wear out quicker and would need replacement after a semester. Thus by using a leather reusable basketball we cut back on the waste created by throwing away and purchasing a new ball. These environmentally friendly reusable basketballs are a prudent and responsible purchase that can be reused year after year.

Access (Total = 1 point)

This equipment provides each student the opportunity to participate in the course with the correct size ball.

Regardless of gender, ability, or physical impairments students can choose a lighter or heavier ball or a ball that is bigger or smaller in circumference. This equipment helps instructors meet students needs and encourages universal access to the curriculum. Thus, allowing all students to meet learning objectives.

*Universal design is an approach that addresses and redresses the primary barrier to making expert learners of all students. Some examples include: light switches with large flat panels rather than small toggle switches; buttons and other controls that can be distinguished by touch; bright and appropriate lighting, particularly task lighting; auditory output redundant with information on visual displays; visual output redundant with information in auditory output; contrast controls on visual output; use of meaningful icons with text labels; clear lines of sight to reduce dependence on sound; volume controls on auditory output; speed controls on auditory output; choice of language on speech output. Items incorporating the principles of universal design feature: equitable use; flexibility in use; simple and intuitive; perceptible information; tolerance for error; low physical effort; and size and space for approach and use.
