Las Positas College Graduation Survey Spring 2024: Results Student Experience



Las Positas College Graduation Survey Spring 2024: Results College-Wide Learning Goals

Overall, most 2023-24 graduates surveyed expressed that as a result of being at LPC they made "Some" or "A Lot" of progress on college-wide learning goals. The skills and abilities graduates reported making the most progress ("A Lot") in were: "Writing Skills" (95%), "Gathering appropriate information to help make decisions" (95%), and "Oral communication and speaking skills" (94%).
